CARE aims to capture and celebrate local histories in Y Stiwdio – for example through exhibitions – and work with partners to deliver activities which encourage skills-sharing, community cohesion, and behaviour change with the use of resources, as well as promoting healthy sustainable lifestyles.

# Fruit & Bounty Sir Benfro

Our Fruit and Bounty project is focused on building and supporting a thriving fruit tree network in Pembrokeshire.

We're working with orchard and fruit tree businesses that make cider, sell trees, produce juice, sell fruit, bake fruit pies and more. We're helping them to build or strengthen their fruit businesses with training, mentoring and networking.

We're also creating a network of "Mother Orchards" around the county to give the public access to cuttings of fruit and nut trees that are best suited to West Wales. They can collect these cuttings for free, to propagate their own trees. Our forthcoming fruit tree variety sharing network opens this up wider, for everyone to offer out cuttings of the varieties of fruit and nut trees they'd like to share from their own gardens.

And we've also been out juicing apples! In 2022 we've run 16 community apple pressing days, pressing nearly 7 tonnes of apples.

# Community Wind Turbine

The community-owned turbine was the project that originally brought CARE into existence, generating enough green electricity to power 450 homes and in so doing, prevents the release of over 400 metric tons of CO2 annually. It is a potent and empowering example of how local people working together can both tackle climate change and generate resources for community benefit. CARE is currently trying to overcome the limitations of the national grid that prevent further renewable energy generation. It is working on a cunning plan to piggy-back a new solar array on to its existing wind connection. This will allow the turbine site to continue generating electricity during calm days when the sun is shining.
