We have two aims

We aim both to minimise food waste and to battle food poverty. Established in 2021, we have grown to a team of over 60 volunteers.

How we work

Every day we collect, sort and store surplus food from local stores. We distribute surplus through food shares twice each week in Newtown.



We also partner with local family centres, nurseries, schools and community cafés to let them share and use surplus food.
